About Humboldt County Association of Governments

The <u>Humboldt County Association of Governments</u> (<u>HCAOG</u>) is a Joint Powers Agency composed of the seven incorporated cities (Arcata, Blue Lake, Eureka, Ferndale, Fortuna, Rio Dell, Trinidad), and the County of Humboldt. It is the designated Regional Transportation Planning Agency (RTPA) as well as the Service Authority for Freeway Emergencies (SAFE).

HCAOG's activities carry out the policies and implementing actions that the Board adopts in the Regional Transportation Plan (RTP). HCAOG's regional transportation goal is for Humboldt County to have a carbon-neutral, multi-modal transportation system that is comprehensive, safe, sustainable, and equitable for all.

Focus Areas

- ▶ Climate Change Preparedness: HCAOG is building collaborative, coordinated programs for reducing transportation sector greenhouse gas emissions with an overall goal of achieving a substantial shift to more walking, biking, and public transit.
- ▶ **Public Safety & Health:** HCAOG adopts the Vision Zero initiative with the goal of eliminating roadway fatalities, with a focus on pedestrians and bicyclists hit by cars. Active transportation is a vital connection to healthy and active communities.
- ▶ Equity & Inclusive Access: Transportation equity seeks fairness in transportation programs and that no group is disproportionately impacted. HCAOG is committed to holding equity and accessibility efforts at the core of our programs and strategies.
- ▶ Housing & Vibrant Neighborhoods: Housing with a relationship to everyday destinations, including transportation options, is key to achieving a high quality of life within our communities. Our agency supports land use policies that encourage less traffic and congestion.

Humboldt Regional Climate Action Plan

The Humboldt County Regional Climate Action Plan is nearing completion. This region-wide effort to set a path to reduce long-term greenhouse gas emissions in accordance with State goals has been led by the County of Humboldt and has involved each of the County's seven cities, HCAOG, Humboldt Transit Authority, Redwood Coast Energy Authority and the Humboldt Waste Management Association. A cornerstone of this plan is establishing a regional climate committee and a climate program manager position to implement the action items in the plan. HCAOG has been identified as the ideal Joint Powers Agency to take this on. As Executive Director, you will have the opportunity to drive this effort forward and take the lead in launching this important regional program.

Regional Zero Emission Fleet Transition and Infrastructure Plan

The Humboldt County Regional Zero Emission Fleet Transition and Infrastructure Plan will guide local government fleets in shifting to zero or near-zero emission vehicles. Based on an in-depth review of fleet duty cycles and master vehicle replacement schedules, the plan will offer tailored recommendations for Humboldt County and its seven incorporated cities. As Executive Director, you will lead this initiative, managing both the project and the consultant responsible for its execution.

North State Hydrogen Fueling Siting Analysis

The North State Hydrogen Fueling Siting Analysis is a study to identify the most suitable locations within Humboldt County to establish hydrogen fueling stations for fuel cell vehicles, taking into account factors like population density, transportation corridors, land availability, and regulatory considerations. As Executive Director, you will oversee this project, leading efforts including stakeholder outreach, across the region.

- ▶ Bachelor's degree in Public or Business Administration, Public Policy, Planning, Engineering, or a related field.
- ▶ 7+ years of management experience in a Regional Transportation Planning Agency, municipal government, or similar public sector organization.
- ▶ A Master's degree is highly desirable but not required.
