

THE DEPARTMENT

The City of Santa Fe's Public Utilities Department is dedicated to delivering essential services that support the health, sustainability, and daily life of the community. Through a range of specialized divisions, the department manages water, wastewater, solid waste, and utility billing services with a focus on efficiency, safety, environmental stewardship, and customer service.







WATER DIVISION

Delivers a safe, reliable, and resilient water supply to meet the current and future needs of Santa Fe residents and businesses.

UTILITY BILLING DIVISION

Provides accurate and timely utility billing and customer support for water, sewer, refuse, and stormwater services with a focus on friendly, efficient service.

ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES DIVISION

Manages solid waste collection and recycling services while promoting environmental sustainability through responsible waste reduction and resource recovery programs.

WASTEWATER MANAGEMENT DIVISION

Safely collects, conveys, and treats the City's wastewater in compliance with all regulations, ensuring environmental protection and public health.

THE POSITION

THE ROLE

The City of Santa Fe is seeking an experienced and visionary leader to serve as its next Public Utility Director. Reporting directly to the City Manager, this executive-level role is responsible for overseeing the planning, operations, and strategic direction of the City's Public Utilities Department—including Water, Wastewater, Environmental Services, Utility Billing/Customer Service, Environmental Compliance, and Enterprise Fund Analysis. This is a unique opportunity to make a lasting impact on a community that values sustainability, innovation, and quality public service.

The Public Utility Director serves as a key advisor to the City Manager on all matters related to public utilities and environmental policy, helping to shape long-term infrastructure and service delivery strategies. This role requires a strategic thinker and skilled collaborator who can foster cross-departmental partnerships, lead complex utility projects, promote financial stewardship, and cultivate a strong organizational culture rooted in public service excellence.

The City seeks an entrepreneurial Director with interest and sophistication to pursue the following major initiatives:

- The City is confronted with a critical need to either construct a new Wastewater Treatment Plant or perform a substantial repair and upgrade of the current plant. Evaluation of those alternatives will be conducted over the next year.
- Efforts are underway to review and increase the City's water and wastewater user fees over a multiyear period.

- The City's Utility Billing operation will be undergoing a major transition from the current billing system to a state of the art, new software program. The transition will be guided by project management consultants.
- Santa Fe's commitment to its environment motivates a strong desire to expand an already reputable Environmental Services/Solid Waste program into a comprehensive, innovative multi-disciplinary Sustainability and Conservation program.
- Water rights and watershed management issues are an important element in planning for new development and maintenance of the physical beauty of the region, which requires charitable coordination with other government agencies, nonprofits and neighborhood associations.

The ideal Public Utility Director will be a dynamic and strategic leader who brings a deep understanding of public utility operations, project management and organizational development. They will be a strong communicator and mentor, capable of leading diverse teams, building partnerships and delivering high-quality, customer-focused service to the Santa Fe community.

This individual thrives in a fast-paced, complex environment and demonstrates resilience, initiative and a commitment to excellence. They will be skilled at balancing big-picture planning with attention to detail while inspiring trust and encouraging collaboration across departments and with external partners.

QUALIFICATIONS & REQUIREMENTS

EXPERIENCE AND EDUCATION

- One year of the appropriate type and level of experience may be substituted for each required year of post-high school education. Additional appropriate education may be substituted for the minimum experience requirements.

- State of New Mexico Water and Wastewater Systems Operator Certification preferred.
- Obtain and maintain a City of Santa Fe driving permit within three months of hire.
