### THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

Lodi's Public Works Department is responsible for planning, coordinating and directing the City's public works programs and services. As a full-service department, it oversees the Engineering, Streets, Water/Wastewater, Fleet, Facility Maintenance and Transit divisions, collectively staffed by 132 employees under the leadership of the Public Works Director, with five employees directly reporting to the Public Works Director.

The department manages major capital projects, long-term infrastructure planning and city expansion initiatives, including annexations and new development. It also serves as the City's Floodplain Administrator and ensures compliance with applicable laws, regulations and engineering standards.

Public Works is led by the Public Works Director and is accompanied by a Deputy Public Works Director, who also serves as the City Engineer. Together, they support division managers and professional, technical and clerical staff. The department values a collaborative culture, technical expertise and dedication to providing high-quality services to the public while maintaining a stable, team-oriented workplace.

### ENGINEERING AND PROJECT MANAGEMENT

Planning, designing and overseeing construction projects, including streets, utilities, facilities and transit infrastructure to meet city standards and support future growth.



# STREETS, FLEET AND FACILITY MAINTENANCE

Maintaining safe, reliable streets, cityowned vehicles and facilities, ensuring operational efficiency and high-quality services for the community.



# WATER AND WASTEWATER SERVICES

Managing potable water treatment and distribution, wastewater collection and treatment, and utilities development in compliance with regulatory standards.
